

CURSOS DE PRIMARIA DE INGLÉS

Duración: 60 horas presenciales.

Distribución de las clases:

Las clases se distribuyen en dos sesiones de una hora cada una (dos horas semanales) a lo largo del curso que comienza a principios de octubre y finaliza a final de mayo, hasta completar las 60 horas de duración. También tenemos viernes alternos clases de juegos, speaking y preparación de los exámenes GESE.

Metodología empleada:

Las clases de primaria se realizan de una manera muy lúdica y dinámica completamente en inglés. En ellas, el alumnado a través de una rutina diaria y de los distintos medios didácticos que utilizamos (vídeos, canciones, fichas divertidas, juegos dentro y fuera del aula, etc.) va adquiriendo las distintas destrezas del idioma. Es importante resaltar la labor de nuestros nativos que asisten habitualmente a las clases de primaria, donde realizan dinámicas de listening y speaking con el alumnado para profundizar en estas habilidades. En clase, a veces, ensayamos teatro, canciones y bailes que serán representados antes de Navidad y al final de curso.

Así mismo, haremos uso de la plataforma virtual *Google Classroom*, ya conocida por nuestro alumnado, para que sirva de apoyo a las clases presenciales con el fin de garantizar una educación aún más completa.

Precio y forma de pago:

El pago se realiza a través de transferencia bancaria en cómodas mensualidades de 45€ para alumnado externos y 39€ para alumnado de SAFA (al tercer curso con nosotros, el alumnado externo pagará como alumno de SAFA) mediante recibos domiciliados, en donde en el primer mes se cobra una mensualidad doble, a modo de fianza, que se descuenta en la última mensualidad del curso.
